**C**lassics for All provides quality training, support and resources to equip state school teachers with the skills they need to teach Ancient Greek, ancient history, classical civilisation and Latin to their classrooms.



Within 10 years we have reached almost **50,000** pupils, working with over **900** state primary and secondary schools throughout the UK.



Our regional networks are integral to our success, as they meet and stimulate demand from schools in their area, forge strong links with universities and other partners and provide much-needed ongoing support and mentoring for teachers.

Learning these subjects can help primary and secondary school pupils by stimulating their curiosity, broadening their horizons and raising their aspirations. It can also help the study of other subjects, such as English, modern foreign languages, history or maths.

We believe in the power of learning classics and want to ensure that more children, regardless of their background, can benefit from the opportunities they provide.

We regularly work with teachers who have little or no prior experience of classics and work in schools in areas of high socio-economic deprivation and low social mobility.

We are delighted to hear of children from schools we are working with as they progress from GCSE to A levels and now, in increasing numbers, to study at university. For some of these children, university was not previously even a consideration.

# Why do we need your help?

**C**lassics for All seeks to introduce classics on a basis that is sustainable into the future and not just for a transitory period. Some schools start with a club before adding classics to the timetable or curriculum.

Some who have started classics want support for further training, perhaps to introduce a second subject, or to equip additional teachers with the skills and abilities to teach classics.

Modest financial support from **Classics for All** can often be enough to embed classics on the school curriculum.

As well as meeting schools' immediate needs, gifts in wills can help us plan for the future, develop our regional networks and improve educational opportunities for young people.

## Your will

Your existing support of **Classics for All** is already greatly appreciated. By pledging a legacy gift for the future, your commitment to our work can continue for the long-term. We are grateful for legacies of all sizes. There are three types of gift that you can leave in your will:



Through a **residual gift**, you can leave the remainder or a percentage of your estate.



With a **pecuniary** or **cash gift**, you can specify the amount you wish to leave.



A **specific legacy** is an item of personal property such as jewellery or shares.

Gifts left to charities in your will are free of Inheritance Tax as they are excluded from the net assets of your estate. By leaving a gift of 10% or more of the net value of your assets in your will to charity, your estate could pay Inheritance Tax at a reduced rate of 36% on some assets, rather than 40%.
