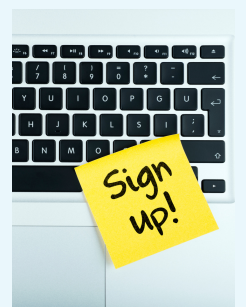

## COURSE CONTENT

### 1: Beginners' Latin

Trainer: Wendy Smith

Dates and times: 3 x 2.5 hour sessions  
10.00-12.30

Content: This course is for those with no prior knowledge of Latin or for those who would like to go back to basics. It will use Cambridge Latin Course Book 1 (5th edition) and will provide a solid introduction to Latin.

### 2: Intermediate Latin

Trainer: Steve Hunt

Dates and times: 3 x 2.5 hour sessions  
10.00-12.30

Content: This group will support teachers who already have some knowledge of Latin and who would now like to teach up to GCSE. The primary focus will be on translating (and teaching how to translate) GCSE unseen language passages.

### 3: Beginners' Greek

Trainer: Angela Dix

Dates and times: 3 x 2.5 hour sessions  
10.30-13.00

Content: This course is for those who are relatively new to learning Ancient Greek (knowledge of the alphabet will be assumed) but who are interested in teaching the new Intermediate Certificate in Classical Greek. We'll aim to cover Chapters 1-4 of John Taylor's Greek to GCSE Part 1.

### 4: Intermediate Greek

Trainer: Steven Kennedy

Dates and times: 3 x 2.5 hour sessions  
10.00-12.30

Content: This course is for those who are comfortable with the content of John Taylor's Greek to GCSE Book 1 and who would now like to progress with Book 2. The primary focus will be on covering new grammar points and practising translation skills.

### 5: Classics at KS3

These afternoon sessions will run from 2-4pm each day. You are welcome to sign up for one, two or all three sessions, depending on your interest. This programme is primarily aimed at those who are interested in incorporating some classics into their teaching of English or History at KS3.
