ONLINE CLASSICS TRAINING: Free CPD for state school teachers

4 x 2 hour sessions, running Tuesday 24th – Friday 27th August 2021

Classics for All, a national charity which works to widen access to classical subjects, is offering **free online training** this summer to support the teaching and learning of Classics. These online courses will replace our popular Latin & Greek courses, held annually at Harrow School in August. This year, we are also delighted to be offering a dedicated Ancient History course for the first time.

This training is open to anyone who is teaching in **state secondary schools and colleges** in the UK. Whether you are interested in introducing Latin, Ancient Greek or Ancient History into your school or college for the first time, or whether you would like to consolidate your own understanding to support what you currently teach, we hope that this CPD opportunity will prove invaluable.

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COURSE CONTENT

NT We hope to run all five groups, provided there is sufficient interest.

1: Beginners' Latin

Trainer: Wendy Smith

Dates & times: 4 x 2hr sessions on 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th August (11am – 1pm)

Content: This course will use Cambridge Latin Course Book 1 and will provide a solid introduction to the basics of Latin grammar.

3: Intermediate Greek

Trainer: Otti Olivero

Dates & times: $4 \times 2hr$ sessions on 24^{th} , 25^{th} , 26^{th} , 27^{th} August (11am – 1pm)

Content: This group is aimed at those who already have some knowledge of Greek and will cover material roughly equating to half a GCSE. The sessions will focus on the basic elements of grammar using John Taylor's Greek to GCSE Part 1.

5: Teaching A Level Ancient History

Trainer: Anna McOmish

Dates & times: $4 \times 2hr$ sessions on 24^{th} , 25^{th} , 26^{th} , 27^{th} August (2 – 4pm)

Content: This group is suitable for teachers who are already familiar with the OCR A level material, as well as those new to teaching the course. Sessions will provide a mixture of support for teaching course material and examination technique.

2: Intermediate Latin

Trainer: Steven Hunt

Dates & times: 4 x 2hr sessions on 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th August (11am – 1pm)

Content: This group will support teachers who already have some knowledge of Latin and who would now like to teach up to GCSE level. The primary focus will be on translating (and teaching how to translate) GCSE unseen language passages with the Eduqas qualification.

4: Advanced Greek

Trainer: Steven Kennedy

Dates & times: $4 \times 2hr$ sessions on 24^{th} , 25^{th} , 26^{th} , 27^{th} August (2 – 4pm)

Content: The group is aimed at teachers who have finished Greek to GCSE, and would like to develop their skills in the language in preparation for teaching A-Level Greek. The primary focus will be on Beyond Greek GCSE Chapters 1-2, but the course will also cover schemes of work, and strategies for delivering the A-Level literature component of both prose and verse.

Classics for All was established in 2009 to reverse the decline of teaching classical subjects in state schools. We aim to raise the aspirations and build the cultural capital of young people from all backgrounds by teaching them about the ancient world.

We provide training for experienced and non-specialist teachers alike and ongoing local support through our 17 regional classics networks. To date we have supported classics teaching in over 940 primary and secondary state schools, reaching over 80,000 pupils.
