

1. What does training cost?

Absolutely nothing! There is no cost to a UK state school for the training we deliver – the trainer is paid directly by Classics for All on submission of invoices.

2. Can you train up more than one teacher at a time?

Yes! We encourage schools to train multiple teachers at once for the sustainability of the programme. We can deliver whole school training sessions or training for just the one or two teachers who will be teaching the material.

3. Who are the trainers?

All our Classics for All trainers are, or have been, subject specialist teachers in UK schools and will have taught the subject they are training you in. They have a wealth of subject knowledge, teaching experience, and can offer advice in all aspects of teaching the subject.

4. When does training take place?

Training is arranged by schools in conversation with their trainers, so can take place at anytime that is suited to both the trainer delivering the session and the teacher(s) being trained. But **all training must be completed with 12 months of accepting your grant.**

We typically offer 6 hours of training for primary school, Key Stage 3 teachers, and training for extra-curricular clubs, and 6–12 hours training for GCSE and A-Level teachers. These hours can be spread throughout the year in shorter sessions of one to two hours (especially if done online) or in sessions lasting the whole day (especially if done in person) and can be arranged during the school day or completed as twilight sessions.

5. Does training take place online or in person?

Training can take place either online or in-person, depending on your preference and the availability of your trainer.

Whilst we will always try to honour a school's training preferences, sometimes the best trainer for your school may be based at the other end of the country and training will need to take place online.

6. What kind of training is available to us?

We can train teachers in subject knowledge and/or pedagogy, and regularly train teachers who have never taught or studied classics before.



We offer training for both curricular and extra-curricular clubs and our trainers can provide advice on planning, delivery, extra reading, exam assessments and more. Trainers will also share all relevant resources with teachers for each course and recommended resources can also be found on our **Resources Hub**.

It is helpful to be as specific as possible about your training needs in your application so we can arrange the most suitable trainer and they can tailor their training to you.

7. What do we expect from our schools?

Whilst all our training, advice and support is free, we do ask schools to confirm the date scheduled for their first training session within one month of accepting your grant, that all training sessions be completed within 12 months of accepting your grant and that you respond to our annual monitoring request emails from your regional network coordinator.

8. Can we apply for more training after the first grant is complete?

Yes! There is no limit on the number of grants you may apply for with Classics for All.

Schools may have additional training for teachers needing to progress further with the course, for new staff joining you, or for an additional course or new classical subject you may be interested in introducing.

The application system is the same, just send a completed application to grants@classicsforall.org.uk with updated information and your request and we will create a new grant for you for your next stint of training. All training will continue to be totally free.

9. What happens if we haven't used up all our training within the year?

If you have exceeded 12 months since you accepted your grant and still haven't used up all your training, please let your local network coordinator know and let us know at grants@classicsforall.org.uk – it is absolutely fine if this is the case.

We understand that sometimes you will take less time than the training hours you have been allocated - in which case we will fall in the remaining funds, and it will be allocated to another school in the future. Equally, if you haven't used up all the training by the end of year, but would like more training the following year, or further down the line, you are welcome to apply again in the same way as mentioned above. Just get in touch to let us know the situation, and we will send you an application form to fill in.

10. What happens if we have new teachers joining our school or current teachers move around the school after we've had our initial training?
